

# Strong geographic concentration of **zero-dose** children enables **targeted subnational strategies**

Catalytic investments to sustainably reach zerodose & under-immunised children

#### What?

- Stronger focus on demand and data
- Selected supply-side interventions where Gavi funding can bring innovative approaches to scale
- Focus on sustainable improvements in RI systems

#### How?

- Exploring multisectoral partnerships beyond immunization, increasing the role of community-based and civil society organisations (CSOs), esp. those focused on demand issues as well as private sector filling capacity gaps
- **Capacity building** in national institutions with the aim of ensuring long-term sustainability and programme performance

## Recommendation

The Gavi Alliance Programme and Policy Committee **recommends** to the Gavi Alliance Board that it:

- a) <u>Approve</u> the strategic approach set forth in Annex A to Doc 10 to continue Gavi's strategic partnership with India for five years (2022-2026); and
- b) <u>Approve</u> the associated investment of US\$ 250 million for 2022-2026, of which US\$ 199 million will be implemented in Gavi 5.0 (2022-2025).
