Country has presented an official request to Gavi to switch from measles vaccine to measles- rubella vaccine for the routine second dose, with country funding the equivalent cost of the rubella component. As such, country will make the required payments to UNICEF SD as indicated in the table below.

Country is required to submit a request for a Cost Estimate to UNICEF, with a clear reference to the approval code and approval year. Country will inform Gavi Secretariat when payment of the respective amount due under this Cost Estimate has been fully made to UNICEF.

In the event that country wishes to revert to measles vaccine, country should inform UNICEF and Gavi immediately in order to agree on an appropriate arrangement
