The government has asked the WBG to support them with a number of reforms, including a health sector review; the shift to mixed payment systems, including capitation with global budgets pay for performance and for primary care facilities; introduction of strategic purchasing through selective contracting and review of options to increase domestic resource mobilization. Additionally, the government is contemplating on revising the benefit package that will be much narrower compared to what it is currently.
