


Recap: Gavi 5.1 journey started in April '22 led by the Board with close PPC involvement

Change vs. Gavi 5.0 'one-pager'





As per financial forecast v20


Gavi core Forecast (2021-25)






Financial implications of Gavi 5.1 (2/2)
