# Acts on behalf of the Board to ensure quality, usefulness and independence of evaluation

- Reviews, provides guidance, and approves work plan
- Assures quality, usefulness and independence of strategic evaluations
  - Provides guidance on scope and questions
  - Assesses final reports
- Collaborates with the Programme and Policy Committee to identify evidence needs and promote timely communication of findings to inform Board decision-making



#### Focus on "Centralised"

#### **Centralised evaluations**

- Strategic importance to Board
- Planned, commissioned and managed by the Gavi Secretariat Evaluation Unit
- Formally assessed by the FAC

# Determined by Executive Office with final approval by EAC

# Decentralised evaluations/reviews

- Secretariat driven questions
- Planned, commissioned and managed outside the Evaluation Unit
- Not assessed by the EAC
- Evaluation unit provides technical support

## Example methodological questions for EAC input

#### **Prospective**

- Sets out goals for an intervention
- Analyses potential intervention to generate the desired change
- Measures how well the intervention is moving towards those goals throughout its lifetime
- Example: CCEOP

#### Retrospective

- Looks backwards
- May collect data during the lifetime of an intervention but lessons are drawn close to, or after, its completion
- Example: Evaluation of Gavi's Eligibility, Transition and Cofinancing Policies



# Evaluation requires Theory of Change and Logical Framework


#### Theory of Change

Shows the big picture with all possible pathways - messy and complex

# Change

#### Logical Framework

Shows just the pathway that your program deals with - neat and tidy




And identification of key assumptions and risks

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### Initial thinking on 5.0 evaluation approach

- Utility focused
- Takes a comprehensive perspective
- Prioritize areas of high strategic value
  - End of Gavi support/transition/sustainability
  - Equity
- Inform and evaluate anticipated programmatic shifts
  - New/refined programmes, policies, strategies

Done jointly with others if possible

Workplan to be defined from outset of strategy period
