





Protecting Our Future The Global Forum for Vaccine Sovereignty and Innovation

Paris, Thursday, 20 June 2024, Indicative Programme

Since 2000, Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance has established itself as one of the most successful development initiatives in history. Working together with countries and across partners, Gavi has immunised over 1 billion children and prevented more than 17 million deaths, helping to halve child mortality in 78 lower-income countries and deliver over US\$ 250 billion of wider economic benefits. It has transformed access to immunisation and reduced prices for life-saving vaccines. In recent years, it has also become central to the broader global health security landscape both through its support of routine immunisation programmes around the world and investments in the world's emergency stockpiles to quickly respond when outbreaks do occur, such as the cholera epidemic that several African countries are currently experiencing.

Under the political leadership of H.E. Emmanuel Macron, President of France, H.E. Mohamed Ould Ghazouani, President of Mauritania and Chair of the African Union, and Prof. José Manuel Barroso, Chair of the Gavi Board, global political leaders will gather in Paris on 20 June 2024 at the Global Forum for Vaccine Sovereignty and Innovation to launch the African Vaccine Manufacturing Accelerator (AVMA), a pioneer initiative to support sustainable vaccine production in Africa, and to unveil the Gavi Investment Opportunity for the 2026–2030 period.

The African Vaccine Manufacturing Accelerator (AVMA), designed by Gavi in close collaboration with Africa Centres for Diseases Control and Prevention (Africa CDC), will make a strong contribution to African Union's Platform for Harmonized African Health Products Manufacturing (PHAHM) ambition to manufacture at least 60% of the total vaccine doses required on the continent by 2040, as well as global effort to strengthen the African health sovereignty at all times, including for pandemic preparedness and response. The AVMA builds upon Gavi's groundwork in equity and innovation in immunisation.

Gavi's new strategic cycle offers a unique opportunity to accelerate its incredible impact – not only to significantly broaden its reach with routine immunisation, but also introduce and scale access to critical new vaccines that tackle long-standing killer diseases as well as respond to a growing number of global crises.

The event on 20 June heralds a historic moment for global health. With political leadership at the highest level converging in Paris, we have an unparalleled opportunity to chart a course for the future of Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, and indeed, for global health security as a whole. As we gather to launch the African Vaccine Manufacturing Accelerator (AVMA) and unveil the Gavi Investment Opportunity for the 2026–2030 period, we envision a world where access to vaccines is universal and equitable. Called to actions by Africa's New Public Health Order, our aim is clear: to accelerate progress, to expand access, and to safeguard the health and well-being of generations to come. Together, we are not just protecting lives; we are safeguarding our collective future.

The HPV vaccine will be raised as one of the most impactful interventions for women and girls in upcoming years.
