

LIST OF COUNTRIES IDENTIFIED FOR CONCERTED SUPPORT BY THE COVID-19 DELIVERY PARTNERSHIP

While the world has made significant progress over the past few months, further work is required to close the vaccine equity gap – particularly for those countries furthest behind.

Africa Centers for Disease Control (Africa CDC), African Vaccine Delivery Alliance (AVDA), Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance (Gavi), WHO, World Bank (WB) and UNICEF have agreed on a common country list of 34 countries to support in concert via the joint COVID-19 delivery partnership, which aims to address bottlenecks related to delivery of COVID-19 vaccines (from both COVAX and non-COVAX sources).

This support will be channelled through a “one country” team of all partner representatives in-country and other key national stakeholders, led by the national government.

The 34 countries selected are those that were below 10% coverage (with two doses) as of January 2022. As coverage rates improve, countries will move past this baseline, but will still be supported by the delivery partnership.
