Service Delivery	1.1 Extend immunisation services to reach zero-dose, underimmunised children and missed communities	JSI worked with the Ga South EPI under the Second Year of Life initiative to develop a tracking system to followup school children that missed out on vaccination. The tracking system has been piloted in 3 districts and JSI proposes to scale up. Strengthen school-based vaccination in 2 regions ( Greater Accra and Northern). JSI proposes to scale up the use of the schoolbased immunization tracker in public and private schools to ensure adherence to the national immunization strategy. The approach is to target both zero dose and missed out children in 2 low-coverage districts in the Greater Accra and 1 district in the Northern regions. JSI will work with the Department of Social Welfare and the School Health Program under the Ghana Education Service to undertake a mapping of all creches and . In the project districts. Selected School Health teachers, Parent Associations, headteachers and school management committees will all be trained in the application of the immunization tracker. After the training, the tracker will be used in the schools to identify children who have missed out or have not been vaccinated. Based on the information gathered using the tracker, vaccination sessions will be organized in the schools or designated vaccination points. Periodic monitoring will be undertaken by GES/SHEP, GHS/EPI, the Dept. of Social Welfare and the Parent Teacher Associations to generate information on tools application and document lessons learned for dissemination.
